Hearts are on more than just the annual love stamps produced by so many countries. In fact, there are some hearts on stamps that illustrate the circulatory vessels along with the heart! The UK just issued a stamp depicting a heart and EKG (See pg. 2). These latter stamps are highly prized by cardiologists and other collectors in the medical field.

Happy Thanksgiving



"A Neat Experience in Paris"

Communication from Dick Colberg

Dick Colberg writes that he continues to be busy in France in philatelic and other pursuits. While engaged in many stamp activities and the local stamp club in their town, he and Nancy make occasional visits to Paris. They discovered a Basque-French restaurant with a new taste which they loved.

One of their arduous activities was a two hour line for a Monet exhibit which, he added, was well worth the wait. Besides stamp dealers and auction houses, Paris abounds with antique shops which they frequent.

Dick learned of a postal history exhibit while in Paris, and after making his way there on public transport, he found that he was in need of a sandwich and soda at the show's restaurant. The hostess was surprised that he wanted to purchase a meal and eat it there. This confused him, and he realized that he was the only one in the snack bar. He then noticed that the show's opening ceremony was about to start in the main hall, and these events are always hosted with food and wine! This is where the other "eaters" were gathered. Dick wonders if wine and cheese

would help draw even more customers to our annual Lancopex show!

The postal history exhibit (Macrophilex) was quite thorough and educational. While he sojourned among the exhibit frames, he met some British collectors talking with the French editor of *L'Echo de la Timbrologie* as published by Yvert & Tellier, France's version of *Scott's Stamp Monthly*. A group photo was taken for the publication.

It's an interesting time to be in France, Dick noted. To reduce the plaguing financial deficit, the French government is proposing to raise the retirement age from 60 to 62 while scrutinizing other benefits. This prompted labor strikes and unrest across the country, necessarily making transportation, commerce, and purchasing most difficult.

This ongoing topic of conversation often slowed somewhat when Dick explained that the retirement age in the U.S. is 65+. Retirement at 62 then looked better to his French colleagues.

Dick is now preparing for his exhibit of *Mexico Express Company Envelopes* at the Caen exhibit in late October.

Collector Congressman in the News

The PSLC may soon become a chapter member of the **American Topical Association** (ATA), as we see topical collecting gaining ground.

In the early 1990s I began a long term study of "The Great War," and a decade later when I returned to the hobby, a WWI topical collection was a natural way to combine my interests. I had a chance to share this as a slide show to the club in 2003.

A lifelong interest in maps has led to another topical collection-maps on stamps. Readers with enquiring minds will recall a short article in this newsletter on Latvian stamps that were printed on the backs of old German WWI field maps. This is a new twist to stamps on maps theme.

The ATA produces many lists of topical stamps, and the number of topics seems infinite. I have not yet taken advantage of the "maps" list because there are so many out there that I am continuously finding.

"Maps" can be further specialized into classical and historical maps on stamps, globes, U.S. or other counties, dead countries, newly independent countries. And so much more. There is no limit

A preference of mine is for realistic, not stylized maps. The bi-color stamp from Ascension depicts this

nicely. The map is crisp enough for one to find their way from one end of the island to the other.

Hikers use topographic maps, and the U.K. Ordinance Survey has lead the way for years. In 1991 they issued a five stamp set showing the progress of a town as depicted on the maps over the two hundred years since 1791.



Germany issued a multi issue set commemorating each state in West Germany. Collectors of heraldry on stamps will enjoy these issues which contain every state and its crest. Depicted below is that representing Bavaria.



Lighthouses are a very popular topical issue, and in 1974 East Germany produced a beautiful 5 stamp set depicting nautical charts and their corresponding lighthouses and a similar set again in 1975. The CTO stamp below from 1974 represents the

1837 and 1902 Arkona light-houses on the Baltic.



This 12/1953 map stamp from Columbia has a little bit for every collector besides a beautiful map of the country's states in various colors. Scott lists this real estate tax stamp as C237 due to its "Correo Aereo" overprint. The surcharge raises its denomination from 10¢ to 15¢, while the remaining overprints designate it as the 2nd National Philatelic Expo in Bogotá, CO.



Following WWII, many colonies sought independent nation status. Several were in Africa as seen on this ½d stamp from

Gold Coast. It contains a map of the country with an overprint denoting independence for Ghana on the 6th March 1957.



For those desiring more of a stylized map, the 1980 Virgin Islands souvenir sheet will appeal to the Exploration topic with Francis Drake, Queen Elizabeth I, and Drake's ship.



Canada issued a se-tenant set portraying the progression of the Canadian map from 1867 to 1949. It is a geography lesson in itself. Below is that stamp representing 1905. Newfoundland would unify in 1949.
