

THE PENNSYLVANIA POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY (PPHS) IS AN EDUCATIONAL ORGANIZATION DEDICATED TO THE STUDY, PRESERVATION, AND PUBLICATION OF MATERIAL RELEVANT TO THE POSTAL HISTORY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

LANCOPEX APPRECIATES THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPONSOR THE PPHS MID-YEAR MEETING. ALL INTERESTED PERSONS ARE INVITED TO ATTEND THE 2 P.M. MEETING ON SATURDAY.

THE FULTON OPERA HOUSE

FULTON HALL WAS COMPLETED IN 1852 BY CHRISTOPHER HAGER, A LANCASTER MERCHANT AND CIVIC LEADER. THE OFFICIAL OPENING ON OCTOBER 14,1852 WAS ATTENDED BY APPROXIMATELY 1200 TO 1500 PEOPLE. TWO YEARS LATER THE HALL WAS RENAMED THE "FULTON OPERA HOUSE" IN HONOR OF ROBERT FULTON, THE LANCASTER COUNTY INVENTOR. A WOODEN STATUE OF FULTON WAS PLACED ON A PERCH ABOVE THE ENTRANCE WHERE IT REMAINS TO THIS DAY.

THE FULTON IS RICH IN HISTORY AND LEGEND. IT IS BUILT ON THE SITE OF THE ORIGINAL LANCASTER JAIL WHERE IN 1763 THE MASSACRE OF THE LAST INDIAN TRIBE IN THE COUNTY OCCURRED. THE INDIAN FAMILIES WERE IMPRISONED FOR THEIR OWN PROTECTION AFTER AN EARLIER ATTACK, BUT THE PAXTANG BOYS BROKE INTO THE PRISON BEFORE LOCAL OFFICIALS COULD INTERVENE. THE OPERA HOUSE ALSO SERVED AS A CIVIL WAR HOSPITAL. MANY BELIEVE THE FULTON IS HAUNTED—STRANGE APPLAUSE, DOORS OPENING AND CLOSING, AND UNEXPLAINED MUSIC FROM THE BASEMENT HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

THE FULTON OPERA HOUSE HAS BEEN HOST TO MANY HISTORICAL ENTERTAINERS OVER THE YEARS: MARK TWAIN, W.C. FIELDS, WILLIAM F. (WILD BILL) CODY, WILD BILL HICKOK, JOHN PHILLIP SOUSA, JOHN, LIONEL AND ETHEL BARRYMORE, JOHN WILKES BOOTH TO NAME A FEW.

THE FULTON IS THE OLDEST CONTINUOUSLY OPERATING THEATER IN THE UNITED STATES AND WILL CELEBRATE ITS 150TH ANNIVERSARY ON OCTOBER 14, 2002. THE LANCASTER COUNTY PHILATELIC SOCIETY IS PRIVILEGED TO COMMEMORATE "150 YEARS AT THE FULTON" AT LANCOPEX 2002.




