

The topic will be "Collecting Revenues". Ron started collecting in 1956. Ron explained that all stamps are labels, but get "whacked" with a cancel. The revenue stamp was brought into existence by the government. There are three categories: federal, state and local. The first revenue stamp was issued October 1862. Revenues come perf and imperf. The original intent was for the transfer of property - you match the title of the revenue stamp with the reason you are using it. Revenues were authorized by the government, but not necessarily issued by the government. There are two types of taxes that revenues were used for – these were documentary taxes which are financial transactions and excise taxes which are things we consume. This was a very insightful and interesting presentation. We wish to thank Ron for making the trip from Maryland to present this interesting topic. Lori Hostetler

MEET BILL SNYDER - 2008 CLUB VP


I began collecting in 1995, using stamp collecting as therapy following an operation for prostate cancer. I began by purchasing a collection of US from a fellow member of the Chapel Hill, NC Philatelic Society, and rearranged his collection into a more attractive grouping. Since then I have dabbled in cut squares, postal cards, and airmails. I have retained the US collection, but currently I collect only Newfoundland, specializing in a series of 20 stamps issued between 1932 and 1937 (the Resource Issue). The nice thing about Newfoundland is that it became a part of Canada in 1949, and has not issued stamps since then. There are only about 250 Newfoundland regular postage stamps, plus another couple hundred or so of revenues, tobacco, et al. Except for the stamps issued in the 1850-1870 time period, most others are relatively inexpensive, and I've found a reliable dealer in Canada to work with. I hope, health willing, to put the collection of the 20 Newfoundland issues into a package suitable for display by adding proofs, covers, and cancels of each of the 20 items.
