JIM BOYLES was our speaker last month. JIM gave us all some helpful pointers in exhibiting for Stamp Shows.


JIM noted we should use <u>clear</u> mounts, not black ones when exhibiting. We should also use white paper as opposed to colored paper.

We should have some history or write-ups about the stamps to make it educational.

There are different categories in exhibiting -- topical and postal history.

JIM is a well-seasoned exhibitor and he showed us some of the many awards he has received from his efforts. It was also noted the APS has a publication on "How to Prepare a Stamp Exhibit". They also publish a book called Manual on Philatelic Judging that can be quite helpful to serious exhibitors.

We urge members to exhibit this year and make our show interesting. This is one way to "educate" the public on our interesting hobby. THE THEME OF OUR SHOW THIS YEAR IS STAMP DUCATION. We encourage members to enter in our educational process.
