

He stole about 300 A.F.S. sales books from the U.S. mails. James T. De Voss, A.P.S. sales manager, credited A.P.S. microfilm records for the conviction.

Hungary - Scott #C81, miniature sheet issued in 1949 to delebrate the 75th anniversary of the Universal Postal Union, is very scarce.

Swaziland - Scott #67-79, provisional set of surcharges, is urgently wanted by London dealers for almost double its face value.
