Socked on the Nose, What does that mean?

Well, "socked on the nose" is the same as "buliseye". It is a cancellation that is nearly or totally centered on a stamp.

There are many collectors of such cancellations and there are many ways to collect therm. Of course, trying to collect one for each day of the year (referred to as a "calendar") is one way of doing it.

Collecting by country, stamp issue, city of postmarking, etc., are other ways.

There is a Bullseye Cancel Collectors Club that issues a quarterly bulletin and offers a directory, sales book circuit and auction all for \$15 annually.

The contact address is in Spain, but you may be able to contact them through their website.

An interesting link of the site refers to an older article in <u>Linn's</u> that helps to translate dates in postmarks.

For example, the Bishop's postmarks in the mid 1700's is shown in the article. The postmark shows a circle with a horizontal line. Above the line is the number 13 for the date. Below it shows a IV.

It is easy to mistake the IV for April, but it is really for June, as the symbols are capital Roman letters JU. This would be a good article for any postal historian to read.
