## "Locals" alone can be a lifetime of study...

A Glossary of Terms for the Collector of United States Stamps, published by the United States Stamp Society, roughly defines "locals" as "stamps issued by private companies operating in limited service areas."

It continues, "most of these stamps were issued by companies operating in a single city..." often as a sort of personal delivery and pick up of mail service.

The definition adds that "local stamps were also issued by independent mail routes and express companies." An example of this was Wells Fargo. Beginning in 1845, express companies were required to pay regular postage in addition to the express company's charge.

The *Scott Catalog* designates locals by an "L" with a number before it according to the glossary.

A very active specialized society centers on this area of philately and it is called the Carriers and Locals Society. Dues are \$35 annually—more expensive than many but the club has a great output of materials.

In addition to the quarterly publication, <u>Penny Post</u>, the organization has a greatly informative website. Just for fun, visit it and look around.



Four CDs are available for purchase, two of them on D. O. Blood's Co. of Philadelphia, a highly collected local post of the middle of the 1800's.

There is a good reference set, *Identifier for Carriers, Locals, Fakes, Forgeries and Bogus Posts of the United States*. This is a three-volume work of 1569 pages and 3,340 photographs that cost about \$255.00 total. This book is more important than you might think. Early publications were so poor that the worst have been called erroneous and mythological. Some pioneer authorities seemed to allegedly promote fraudulent issues, according to some modern collectors.

Current collectors and the locals club appear to be working very hard to present a correct history of this area of mail handling.

The organization's 2016 meeting, by the way, will be held in New York, probably at the international show our club may be visiting.

Note: There will be no regular December meeting as there will be a Christmas banquet.
