

Perfins: Great Study Potential Yet Very Affordable

If you are looking for a new area of collecting that offers superlative opportunity for discovery while working within a budget—perfins are it!

The term perfin stands for "perforated initials" or "perforated insignia."

Dating to the late mid-1800's, perfins were in their heyday from about 1908 to the 1950's.

Their use was prompted by the thievery of office clerks who would steal stamps from employers and cash them in for money at the post office—a practice allowed in England where perfins originated.

To combat this issue, companies began to punch letters or symbols into the stamp to mark postage as their own.

If a clerk took a stamp to the post office, or tried to sell it as discount postage, it would be instantly recognized as stolen.

The cover pictured above shows an inset with the clear FVS/McC pattern of the Finch, Van Syck & McConville dry goods company in Saint Paul, Minnesota on cover. Most perfins exist off cover.

The Perfins Club, organized in 1943, is very active with a bi-monthly bulletin, publications, sales circuits and a brief but helpful website.
