

# Naval Covers document U. S. Sea Power history

#### What is a 'Naval Cover.'

Generally, a Naval Cover is usually an envelope mailed from a United States naval ship.

Except for World War II, the cancellation usually would show the name of the ship as does the one in the picture above.

It all began when Congress in 1908 authorized post offices aboard larger war ships. In other words, if you were a sailor aboard the U.S.S. Oregon and mailed a letter, the postmark would read the name of your ship, just as if you sent a letter from Reading, PA, the name of the city would appear in the cancel.

The postal handling was done by sailors, not federal postal workers.

Originally, a service for our navy personnel, it gradually became a hugely popular collecting area. Individuals would send one, five or fifty stamped covers at a time to mail clerks. Commercial cachet makers could send hundreds.

At the June meeting, you will learn about one of these cachet makers who rented space in the Sibley's Department Store in Rochester, NY, and his personal confrontation with the coming of World War II.
