

I collect Stamps on Stamps (SOS) and in particular those stamps pertaining to the Penny Black and Sir Rowland Hill. Last year was the 175th Anniversary of the Penny Black and many countries had some rather nice issues.

However, many countries had issues to "jump on the bandwagon".

One country, Madagascar, jumped a little too quickly and without checking without checking the design and issued the following Mini-Sheet.





There is one small or rather HUGE problem.

The picture of Sir Rowland Hill is the WRONG Rowland Hill. By googling on the internet the Rowland Hill on the mini-sheet turns out to be a Church of England Minister who died in 1833!

The real "Sir Rowland Hill" is the next image. No comparison !!

In addition the designer chose to use a version of the Penny Black which has the letters V and R in the top corner squares.

This was proposed but never issued.

At least he got the Elizabeth Tower with Big Ben right to depict London!!

With such an egregious error I am debating whether this should be in my SOS collection! However, should Dave Hunt get one for his Errors and Omissions Collection?
