Above is a "crash cover" postal inspectors retrieved from the German Airship Hindenburg on May 6, 1937. It is on display at the National Postal Museum in Washington, D.C.

It has been announced that the Reading and other local stamp clubs are organizing a bus trip to the National Postal Museum for Thursday, September 21, later this year.

The Hindenburg cover above is just one of millions of items conserved at this premiere institution.

The Hindenburg was an 803-plus foot hydrogen-lifted airship. To give perspective, not counting the end-zones, that is almost three football fields in length. On that fateful day in 1937, the ship caught fire and was destroyed in 32 seconds. Video of the disaster can be seen on the Postal Museum's website.

The ship carried an estimated 17,609 pieces of mail. Officially, 358 pieces were salvaged. Some were fine or slightly singed. Covers like the one above were forwarded in glassine bags. Forgeries exist.

Some mail was dropped off on the way, but documented by markings as to be on this, the ship's 63rd flight. John P. V. Heinmuller donated this and over 2,000 other Zeppelin covers.

#1. Spain- Scott #418 to 432 (missing E-8) with hinge remnants on some but generally no hinge. Cat. Value = \$96.60 Selling Price = \$30.00

#2. U.S Album sheets - NO BINDER – NO STAMPS –just sheets, Beginning with #1 thru 1973. Selling Price = \$3.00
#3 POPES VISIT TO AUSTRIA – AUGUST 1983. Maxi Sheet – maxi cards – coins. Selling Price = \$8.00

#4. U.S.NATIONAL PARKS ISSUE Full set, both perf and imperf – Perf set w/ very lite hinge marks.....Imperf set has no gum (normal) and no hinge marks. Cat. Value \$9.45 Perf. And imperf. Set Cat. Value \$14.50 Selling Price \$8.00

#5. U.S.PARCEL POST – Q10 Mint. Cat.Value is \$280.00 Key Stamp to the set. Selling Price \$70.00
#6. U.S.DUCK STAMP – 1935 RW2 Mint.- Slight Gum Disturbance. Cat. Value \$700.00. Key to the set. Selling Price \$150
