Our November program will be a presentation on four recent U. S. International Stamp shows, including the 1976 exhibition commemorated by the above stamp (left).

This program was developed and will be presented by Paul Peterson of the Lancaster club. Paul is an articulate speaker and the November 7th meeting will be engrossing, your editor guarantees it.

Since 1913, the rotating international show comes to American once every decade. The last show was held in 2016 in New York City and was a "Roy Baardsen Bus Trip."

These are great shows, lasting a week or so with upwards or 200 dealers (including some overseas), as many as 200,000 attendees, booths manned by the U. S. and foreign stamp-issuing agencies and exhibit frames that seem to span as far as the eye can see. Really, I mean that—at the 2006 Washington Show I climbed some stairs and was able to look out over the exhibit area and it seemed endless. Throw in special commemorative issues, guests, specialty stamp club meetings and presentations.

ATA offers free spooky topical checklist



"From goulies and ghosties and long-leggedy beasties And things that go bump in the night,

On Friday, Oct. 13, the American Topical Association offered an early Halloween treat: a free Topical checklist of ghosts and spirits to download from the ATA website

The checklist is available to both ATA members and nonmembers. A free holiday checklist has become a popular tradition, according to Vera Felts, ATA executive director. Past years' lists have included the characters of Charles Schulz, candy, gingerbread, turkeys and Halloween.



The ATA database of more than 1,200 checklist topics was developed by Karen Cartier And is maintained by Dominic Sgro and Beth Scully. This year's free holiday list was augmented by past ATA president Jack Andre Denys and Halloween Spook-tacular Study Unit members Denise Lazaroff and Jean Stout.
