# TOPICAL COLLECTING, THE LATEST PASTIME FOR STAMP FANS

The day of the worldwide collector is long gone. With more than 10,000 new stamp issues each year and the total of all stamps ever issued hovering around the half-million mark, any daring soul wanting to mount a world-wide collection of postage stamps today should be loaded with money and time.

For those of us with fewer precious resources, there is specialization: Collect just a handful of favorite countries or a few topics of personal interest.

Topical collecting, in fact, continues to increase in popularity as a way of defining one's stamp collecting activities.

Whatever your fancy, there are probably stamps from around the world depicting that subject.

The American Topical Association (ATA), an organization of thousands of stamp collectors who assist each other in collecting by subject, publishes hundreds of lists of stamps depicting topics such as cats, dogs, birds, doctors, politicians, flags, trains, cars, ships and more. For information on available lists and ATA membership information, write to ATA, Box 630, Johnstown, PA 15907.

In addition to the ATA, there are numerous clubs that specialize in collecting a given topic on stamps. Here are details on a few that may interest you.

-- Sports Philatelists International, c/o Robert L. Mummert, 601 Greendale Road, York, PA 17403. Publishes the Journal of Sports Philately six times a year. Focus is on stamps that depict basketball, baseball, the Olympics and other sports-related topics.

- -- Space Topics Study Group, c/o Bernice Scholl, Box 522579, Marathon Shores, FL 33052. Specializes in all stamps depicting astronauts, space flight and exploration. Publishes Astrophile bimonthly.
- -- Collectors of Religion on Stamps, c/o Verna Shackleton, 208 East Circle Street, Appleton, WI. 54911 Publishes the COROS Chronicle journal six times each year. Group centers on religious themes such as the Bible, churches and cathedrals, Easter, Christmas, the Koran, missionaries, monks and prayer among dozens of others.
- -- Lions International Stamp Club, c/o Dennis A. Clark, 8174 Electric Avenue, Vienna, VA 22182. Stamps that honor Lions International and its worldwide activities capture the attention of LISC members.
- -- Rotary on Stamps, Box 333, Hanover, PA 17331. Collecting Rotarian stamp issues more than 1,000 different from more than 100 countries. The Rotary on Stamps Bulletin is published about every other month.
- -- Ships on Stamps Unit, c/o Robert P. Stuckert, 2750 Highway 21 East, Paint Lick, KY 40461. Boats, yachts, dinghies and, of course, ships on stamps signal a siren call for the SOS Unit. Publishes Watercraft Philately bimonthly.
- -- Lighthouse Stamp Society, c/o Dalene Thomas, 8612 West Warren Lane, Lakewood, CO 80227. The Beacon is this club's bimonthly journal. Contact them if lighthouses brighten your stamp collection.

LUCY EYSTER and PETER BILLIS did a fine job on the Program and even made a couple of bucks from the advertisements.


Sales of covers were brisk -- We are still receiving mail orders from Spain, Germany and, of course Hawaii.
