AMERICA'S FIRST STAMPS

The start of United States philately for many collectors is the 1847 general issue 5 cent Benjamin Franklin and the 10 cent George Washington stamps. Prior to that time the cost of delivering a letter was paid at the post office by the recipient of the letter and depended on the weight and distance traveled. An act of Congress of March 1845 did much to standardize the cost of mailing a letter by establishing 5 cents per 1/2 oz. for distances under 300 miles, and 10 cents per 1/2 oz. for distances over 300 miles. But it was not until the March 3, 1847 act of Congress that the much needed improved Post Roads and the issuance of stamps was authorized. These stamps were to be placed on a letter or packet to indicate prepayment of the necessary postage. This act became effective July 1, 1847 making the United States the fourth country to issue postage stamps. Great Britain in 1840, Brazil and some Switzerland cantons in 1843 predated the United States.

The stamps were printed by Rawdon, Wright, Hatch & Edson of New York City whose initials can be found at the bottom of the 5 and 10 cent stamps just above the bottom frameline. New York City received the stamps on July 1 probably, Boston on July 2, Philadelphia July 7 and Washington July 9. By the end of July 1847 only 11 cities had received the stamps. During the four years that the stamps were in use there were five printings which experts have studied with care. Although the general issue of July 1, 1847 was demonetized July 1, 1851 examples of covers used after that date exist.

Specialists continue to research the 1847 issue.


