




FRANCES BRUNDAGE

(No. 2 in a Series on Postcard Signed Artists by Dick Pendergrast)

Frances Lockwood was born on a farm in Newark, New Jersey in 1854. Her father was artistic and was an engraver but he deserted the family when she was a teenager.

Frances took to art work herself. She did paintings for Louisa May Alcott books and illustrations for Shakespeare plays. When she was 32 she met and married William T. Brundage, a marine painter. They lived in New York and summered in Cape Ann, Massachusetts. It was then that she did postcard work for Raphael Tuck and later for the Sam Gabriel Company. She died in 1937 at age 82.
