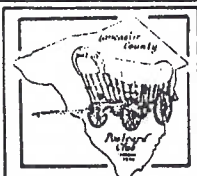

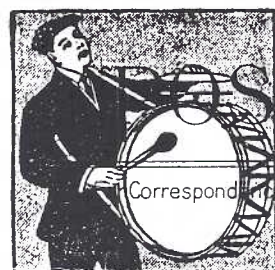

## IT'S SUNDAY SCHOOL RALLY TIME!

September and October were big months for sales in RALLY DAY POSTCARDS in bygone days. Why? Because it was time to round up the vacationing children and at the same time persuade those with poor attendance records to 'rally' back to Sunday School where they were missed.

These annual reminders were most often attractively colored. And their themes ran the gamut of sports, 'modern' transportation, patriotism and family togetherness as well as appropriate religious themes.

Finding RALLY DAY postcards is not an easy task - usually. You must look under 'Religion', 'Children' and even 'Artist-signed'. If a dealer has a RALLY DAY category, of course that makes the job easier. EXCEPT that now you must sort some more...

### WHEN RALLY DAY ISN'T RALLY DAY

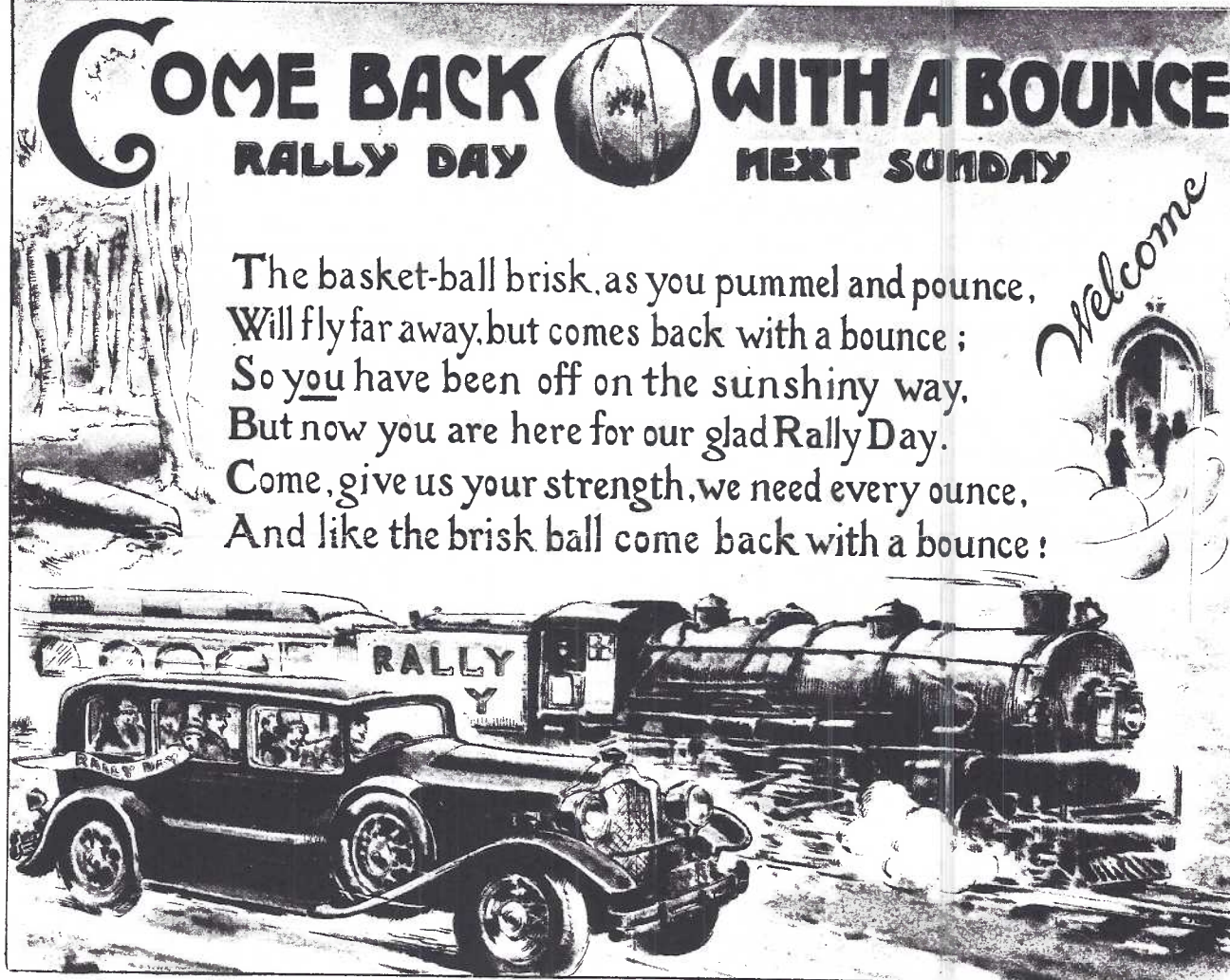
Once you've found the little hoard of 'Rally Day' cards, look more closely. Does it say RALLY DAY? Read the back (there are two sides to every coin/postcard). Sometimes

the clue is in the personalized message from the Sunday School teacher. Of course a fall cancellation will help to qualify it.

Other postcards you're likely to find would be Cradle Roll Call/Birthday Greeting perhaps Easter or Christmas greetings, Sunshine PCs (for illness) and even Children's Day (with a June cancellation).

You could be lucky and find an Ellen Clapsaddle card. But certainly C.M. (Clara) Burd cards are the most popular (as well as the most prolific) among artist-signed RALLY DAY PCs. And deservedly so. Her RALLY DAY cards, however, don't seem as plentiful as her CRADLE ROLL. Highly sought Burd art (see example) dates in the teens and 1920's.

Dates we have seen on RALLY DAY PCs range from 1903 to 1977 and were used by these denominations: Baptist, United Brethren, Methodist Episcopal, Lutheran, Presbyterian and Reformed. In a local collection the Faith Reformed and Trinity Lutheran Churches (Lancaster) were more plentiful.



A real prize is this great folded RALLY DAY Basket Ball Invitation postcard from G&W Co., NYC. It is cancelled Sep. 29, 1922, Buffalo, NY and mailed to Elmira, NY. Besides the Sun. School teacher's own message, the reverse reads: "Your own INVITATION- COLORFUL, INTERESTING, IMPORTANT. PLEASE READ IT AND SURELY HEED IT

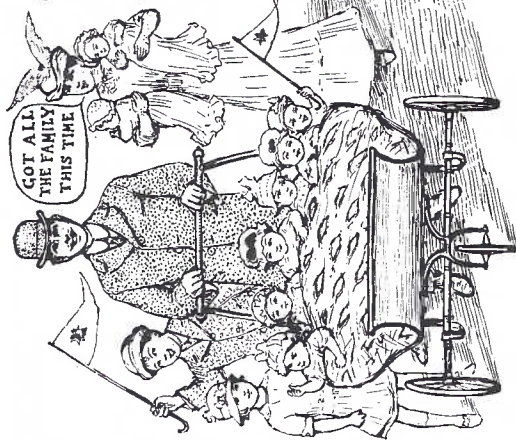

## A WHITNEY HALLOWE'EN

In 1988 C.J. Russell and Pamela E. ("The Hallowe'en Queen") Russell published a neat little illustrated check-list of Whitney Halloween postcards. It's in our Library\*

Their introduction to Whitney and how he left the gin business and specialized in Valentine PCs is short but 'full of meat'. In case you didn't know it, Whitney DID publish quite a few neat HALLOWEEN cards, too.

In the right column are two from the set of six CAT WITCHES. Below is one from an unnamed set of twelve(?) PUMPKIN PEOPLE AND FRIENDS (Editor's name).

Two POST CARD backs exist. Before 1914 Old English "PC" was used. The "Whitney Made" back appeared from 1914 into the 1920's.

Many HALLOWEEN POSTCARDS are expensive, as holidays go, but you can 'get your feet wet' on moderately priced Whitneys.
