


A HATS OFF salute to them all! Where could you find a better bunch -'cept maybe on a grapevine!

Our local subject this month is making the headlines. On a dozen or more postcards dating from the Golden Age to Chromes is a building most of us know as the J.B.Van Sciver Furniture Store. It's found on several linens and chromes, all by Curt Teich & Co.

Older cards with one exception (see check list) call it the Follmer-Clogg Umbrella Factory.

The landmark corner tower disappeared soon after **Van Sciver's** purchased the property. **Curt Teich #5B-H53** is much scarcer than its 'sister card' of the linen era.

And the headlines? Well if we can believe the artist's sketch, the tower to be rebuilt will mirror the grand one which appears on our early views. Let's hope so!

Oh, yes, why the grandiose renovations? The huge building shall become **The Umbrella Works**, an 84-unit apartment complex with 2,000 sq.ft. of retail/office on the first floor. Occupancy will be restricted to 'those who make between \$13,000 to \$32,000' according to newspaper stories of the last three months.

Perhaps we'll have yet another great PC to signify another collecting era. Should we designate a STANDARD-SIZE COMMITTEE to encourage a standard-size postcard or shall we sit back and await another 4"x 6"?

The 113-year old property is at West King and Mulberry Streets in Lancaster, PA.




