SUGGESTION: use a microphone w/wo the projector so we can all hear better (including the note-taker).

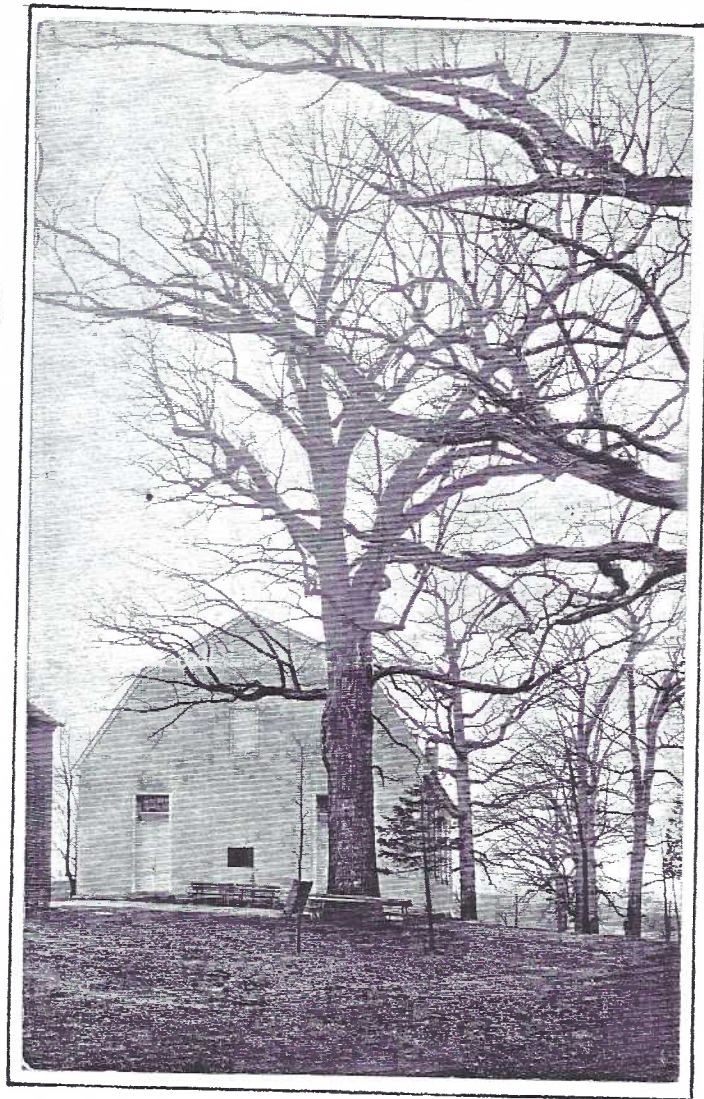
Vice President Ruth Frankhouser announced these future programs:

A 1918/1930 real photo PC shows the huge white oak before the Donegal Presbyterian Church in northwestern Lancaster County. Although it succumbed to the saws of the arborist on June 4, 1991, the site still has considerable significance. A 275th birthday celebration continues on page two.

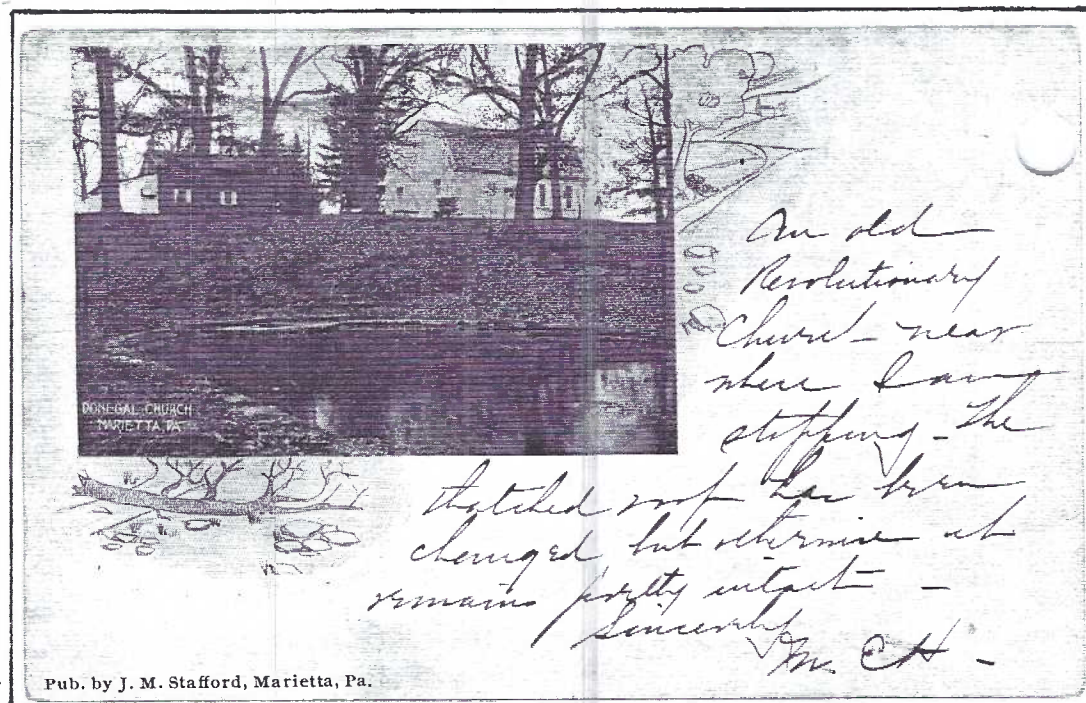
DONEGAL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH MARKS 275 YEARS

The Donegal Presbyterian Church sets on 14 acres of picturesque countryside in East Donegal Twp., Lancaster County. A log structure, the Donegal Meeting House, was replaced by the present stone building c.1740. The young congregation grew to become 500 strong by the 1790's.

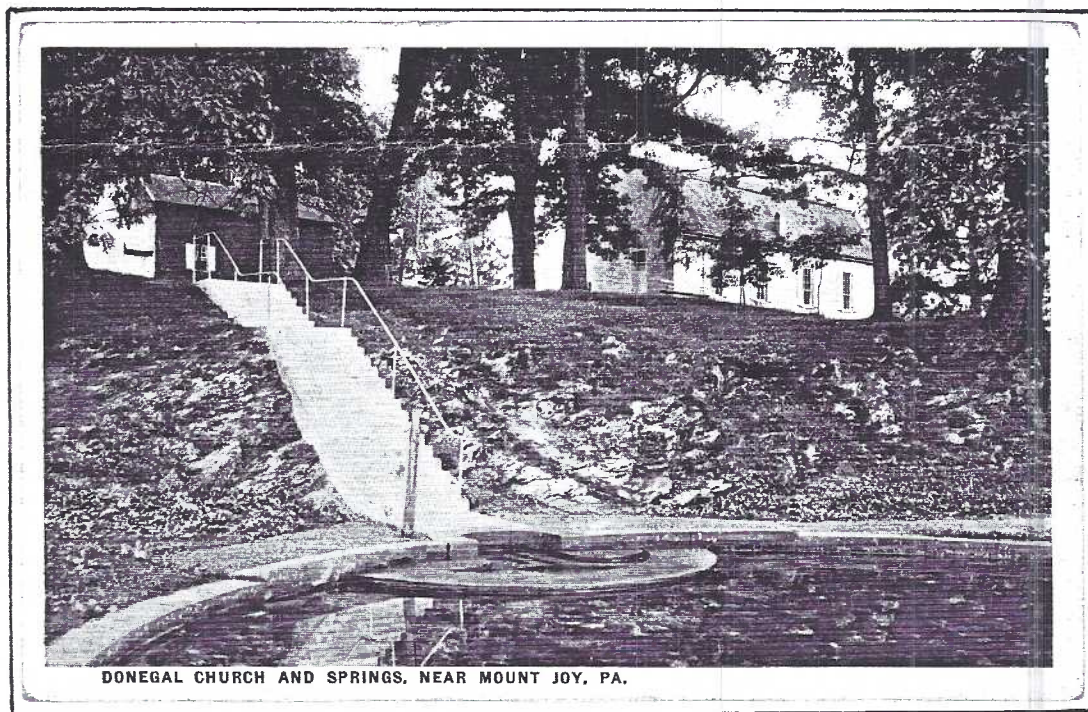
Membership dwindled after that to only 15 people by 1900. Folks moved out. River towns were thriving back then.

Today there is renewed interest in the old church. Hardly a third of the 180+ members are of Scots-Irish heritage. But many travel over 20 miles to worship Sundays in the historic church.

The famous Witness Tree (see tablet on enlarged PC) was planted about the time the stone edifice went up. Harsh wind storms and summer droughts proved too much for the giant. It's 30-foot trunk and dwindling branches had to be removed in 1991.



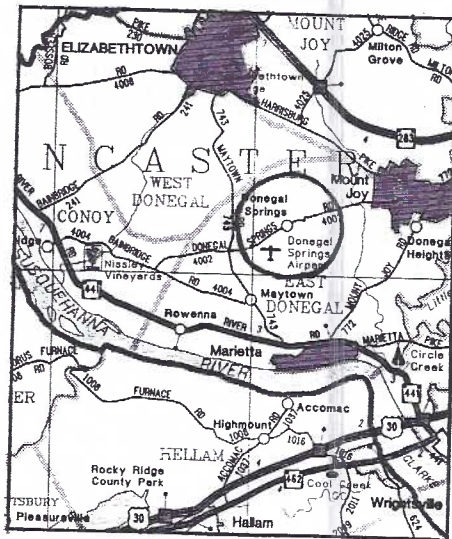
An Express Printing PC for pub. J.M.Stafford, Marietta, mailed in 1908 from Marietta to Rev.Derby, Leonia, Bergen County, NJ. The small photo allowed space for a message on the front suggesting an early undivided (no message allowed) back PC. The card does have a divided back so Express simply used the old format front into the new d/b era. "MEH", accustomed to the old format, wrote his/her message on the picture side, leaving the space for message completely clean! "An old Revolutionary Church near where I am stopping. The thatched roof has been changed but otherwise it remains pretty intact."



An acorn was planted next to the old stump. Wood was used for trimming on a new church organ and crosses, bells, plates, bowls and coasters will be available to the congregation through the Church's Historical Committee.

The congregation celebrates the church founding every 5 yrs. and an updated book documenting the church history "Donegal Presbyterians" is available.

The map shows Donegal Spring's geographical position. There was no town - no post office nor a general store, just a fine spring and the church, so cards were merchandised for this historic landmark by publishers in Marietta, Mount Joy, Elizabethtown and even Hershey and Harrisburg in Dauphin County.

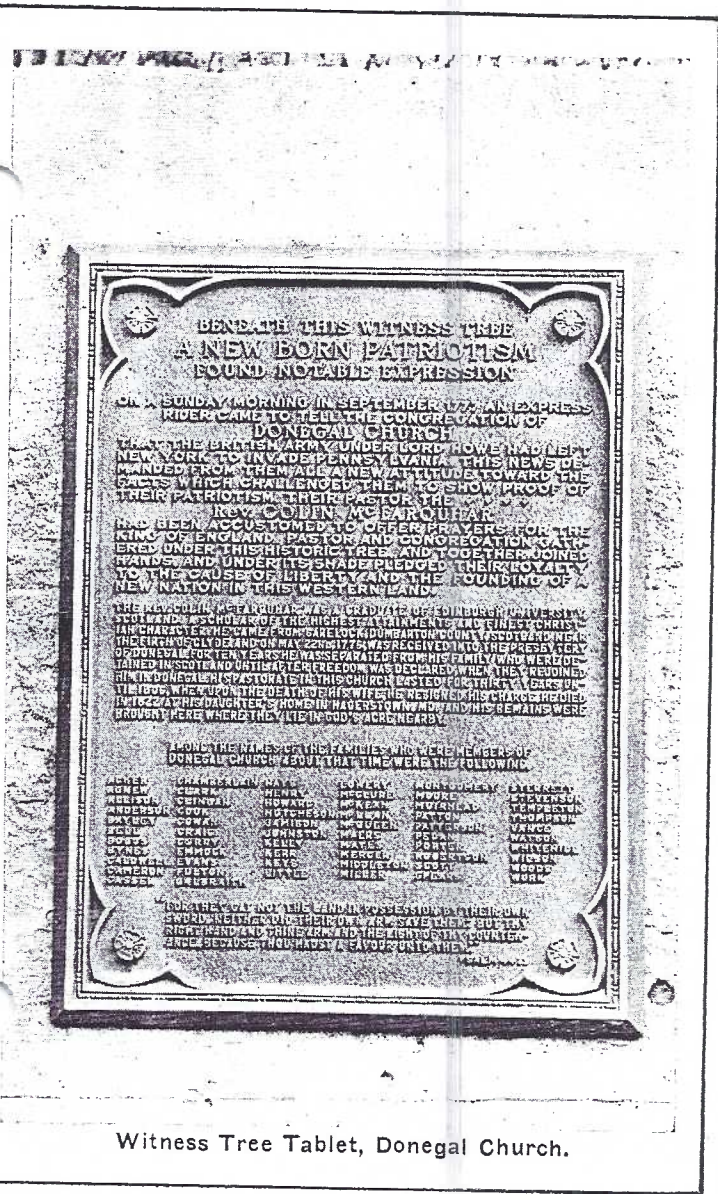

These include divided and undivided backs of the church, the witness tree, the springs and 3 different interiors of the church. Also 1 captioned "Estate of late Senator Cameron, Donegal Pa.". Only one real photo card, an undivided back w/ stamp box, 1918/30 is rubber-stamped PHOTO BY R.C. EVANS, MARIETTA, PA. / DONEGAL CHURCH, FOUNDED PRIOR TO 1721 BY SETTLERS FROM THE NORTH OF IRELAND.

This b/w Auburn card (enlarged 22%) relates the Sept. 1777 story of the congregation and minister pledging their loyalty to the cause of liberty and the founding of a new nation instead of to the king of England.

BUFFALO HUNTER, ARMY SCOUT, INDIAN FIGHTER

150 years ago (Feb. 26, 1846) an American legend was born. William Frederick Cody is certainly more deserving of the cliché than some of the living "legends" (read tripe) in today's entertainment world.

His life spanned years when adventure was easily found in our country- especially if you grew up in the West.

Curt Teich issued an 18-card folder for Johnny Baker, *Souvenir of "Buffalo Bill" Museum & Lookout Mountain, Colorado*, #1144. The cover is linen, the pictures, white borders. Baker pictures himself with a caption "foster son of Buffalo Bill". I found it best to temper his "Brief Biography of a Strenuous Life" with that of the Encyc. Britannica.

Cody's father died in 1857 and eleven year old Bill became a messenger for Russell, Majors and Waddell, later Pony Express. He became an accomplished horsewrangler and hunter. He served in the Civil War (his father was anti-slavery) and afterwards continued as a civilian scout for the U.S. Army.

BUFFALO BILL'S WILD WEST. CONGRESS, ROUGH RIDERS OF THE WORLD.



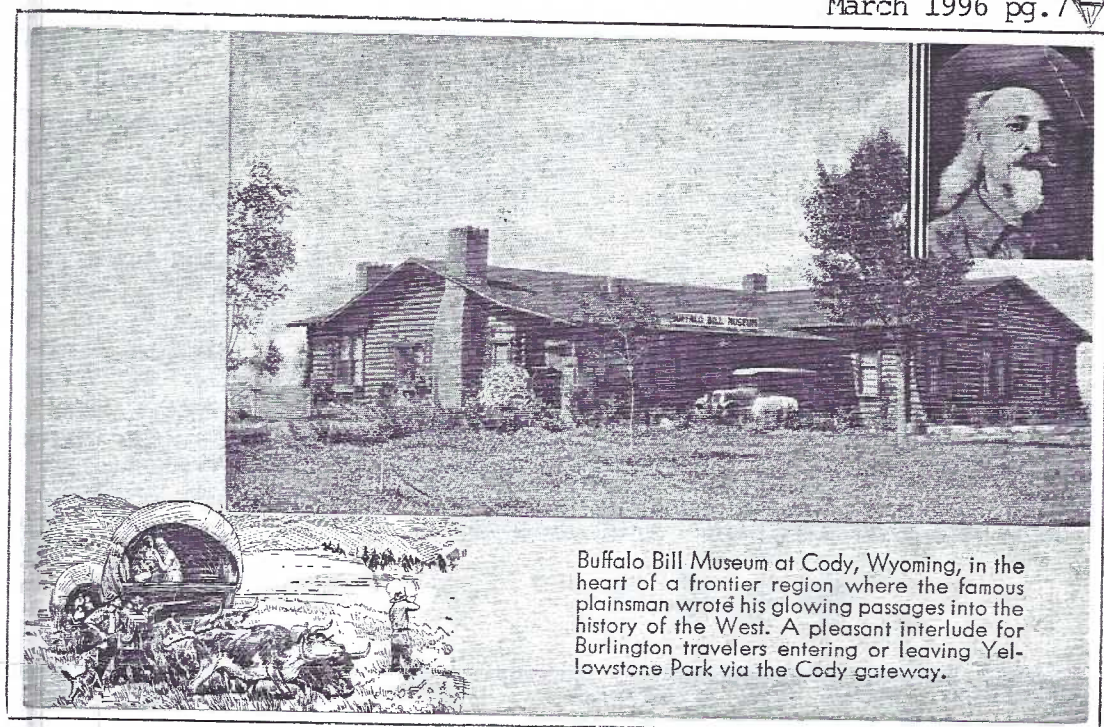
MISS ANNIE OAKLEY,
THE PEERLESS LADY WING-SHOT.

"Little Sure Shot" was the name given by Chief Sitting Bull who traveled with Annie Oakley in the WILD WEST SHOW. Curt Teich PC #7C-K1162, publ. by Cooper PC Co., Lakewood, CO

During the Union Pacific Railroad's construction he hunted buffalo to feed the working crews. His dubious record of killing 4,230 head in eight months earned him his name "Buffalo Bill". Subsequent Indian resistance including 16 separate Indian fights and the scalping of Yellow Hair (not Yellow Hand) added to his almost fictional reputation and a role in the movie *Scouts of the Prairie* written by dime-novel author Ned Buntline.

Cody saw the potential as a showman and in 1883 organized his first *Wild West Show* which toured the US and abroad. Between seasons he escorted wealthy easterners and nobility from Europe through the West.

Mismanagement lost the fortune he made and he died Jan. 10, 1917, two months after his last show in Portsmouth, VA.

The BURLINGTON ROUTE issued this PC as part of its long series encouraging people to travel to Yellowstone National Park. "Daily all summer long, the Burlington operates through Pullmans to and from Cody, Gardiner and Red Lodge gateways to Yellowstone...from Chicago, Kansas City, Omaha and Denver...over the shortest route and in faster time than any other railroad". D/B, no printer named.



Another chrome by the Cooper PC CO., the interior of the BUFFALO BILL MEMORIAL MUSEUM, LOOKOUT MOUNTAIN CO. It's a modern version of a scene from Curt Teich's linen folder w/added souvenir cases. A night view in the folder shows nearby Denver, giving you an idea of Lookout's location. Cody's monument and grave are nearby.
