Major Reeve:

I am only just aware that the contract for postage stamps expires June 30th,1902. It looks as though we have a very short time for getting up designs for a new series of stamps. What I wish to have is, new designs for every one of the series; that is to say, something different from what we are now using, and more artistic if possible. I think you had better get about it at once, in order to be ready for the issue in proper time.

I do not agree with your suggestion to change Franklin from the one-cent stamp. He was the first Postmoster General and it would be a very unpopular move. Keep him there, but present him in a new way, and in a new frame. The same with Washington, and, so far as I see, the rest of them. But perhaps you can make some suggestions for changes that would be acceptable. So far as Washington, Jefferson and Grant are concerned, I doubt the advisability of any change.

I approve of your suggestion to have a 13 cent stamp, and you may proceed with it. We will take some statesman's head for it; perhaps it had better be Blaine or Sherman.

Would like also to have a decided change in the special delivery stamp. I think quite well of your idea of a boy on a wheel.

In the new series I desire the name of the subject under the head, as in the case of the McKinley postal card; at the beginning of the name, the year of birth, and at the end of it, the year of death. Somewhere in the upper part of the stamp the "Series >£ 1902" should appear. This may be so small as to be almost invisible to the naked eye.

Would be glad to have you take up with the Bureau of Engraving & Printing the question of identification of stamps with the office to which they are furnished. If something could be done in that line it would be a great move.


