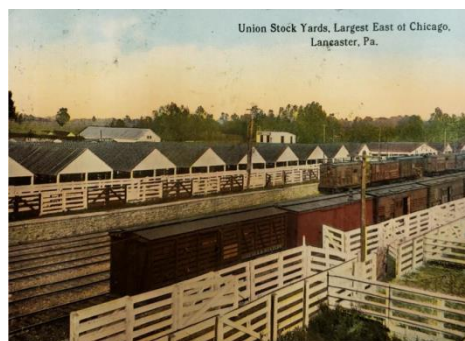

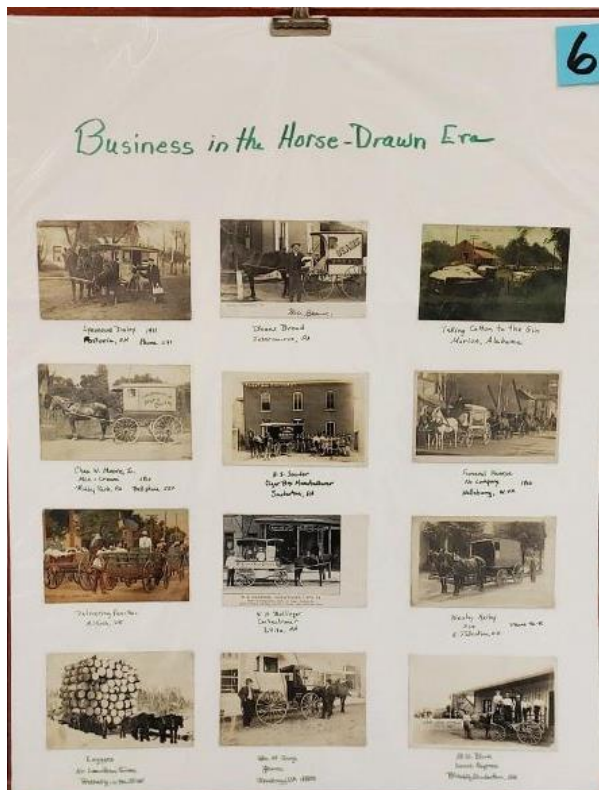

HOLLYWOOD HOMES on POSTCARDS - PART I

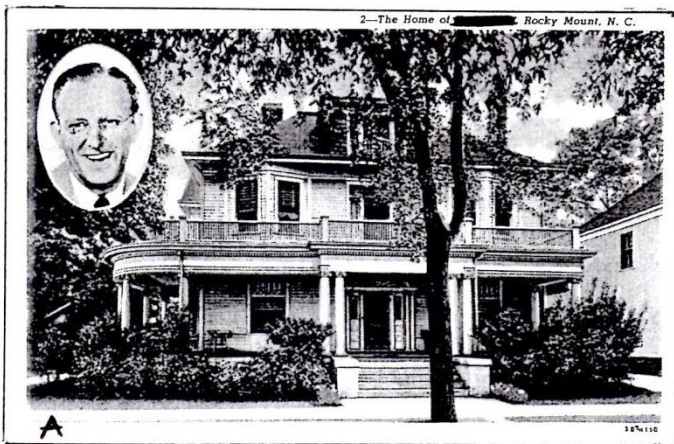
With the demise of postcard production in Germany following World War I, the United States and England soon picked up the slack for the eager collecting crowd. Here, in the US, White Border and Linens were in their prime and the latter found their subjects in Hollywood. Several series can be found with Curtteich creating the lion's share of views.

Let's play a game. Below are BRIEF sketches of the stars. We've blackened their names on the borders. The answers are at the end of the article. Part Two will appear in a future issue of *The Card*.

1.) Unable to afford day-care, she carried her infant daughter to acting classes. Her measurements of 40-21-35 typecast her as a Marilyn Monroe parody. She died in a car accident in 1967.

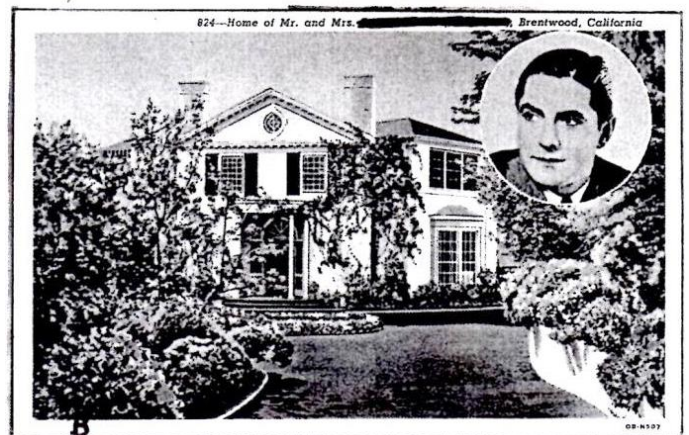
2.) She won two Best Actress Academy Awards in the 1930s. Went through a "slump" but came back to score high in the 1960s and 1970s.

3.) He left the oil fields and had his teeth fixed. His second wife (shown here) died in a plane accident. He was so despondent he joined the Air Force as a tail gunner. His wife was a bathing beauty in silent films. She died without seeing her last film.

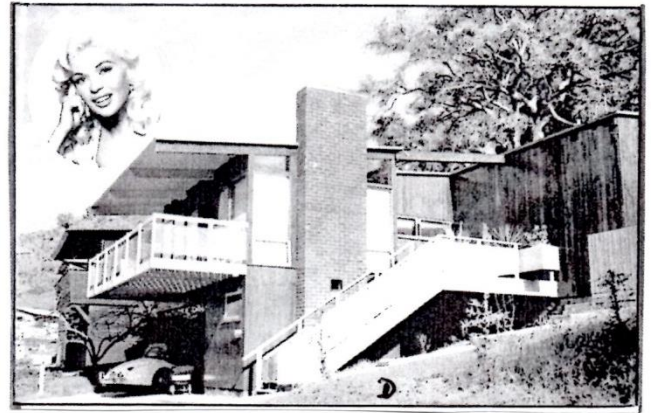
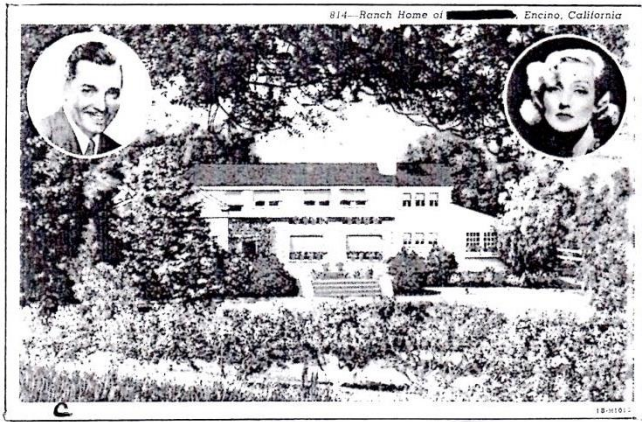


4.) They were born Benjamin Kubelsky and Sadie Marks. She had a wild laugh. He gave other comics laughs at his expense. They shared vaudeville, radio and TV.

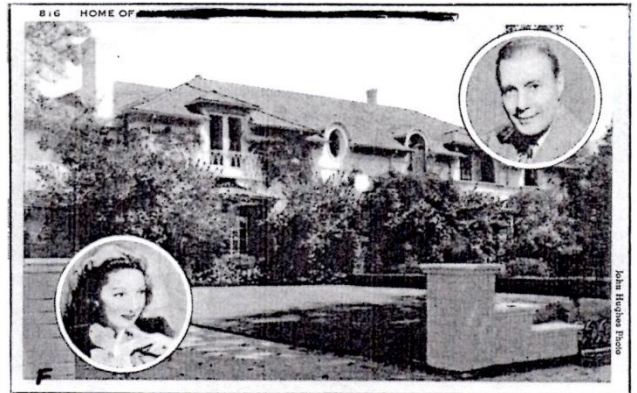
5.) They played in vaudeville then she sang with his orchestra. They became the typical American family on TV from 1952 to 1966.



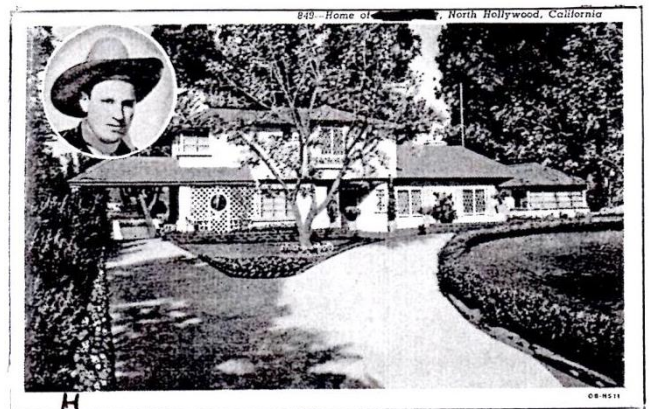
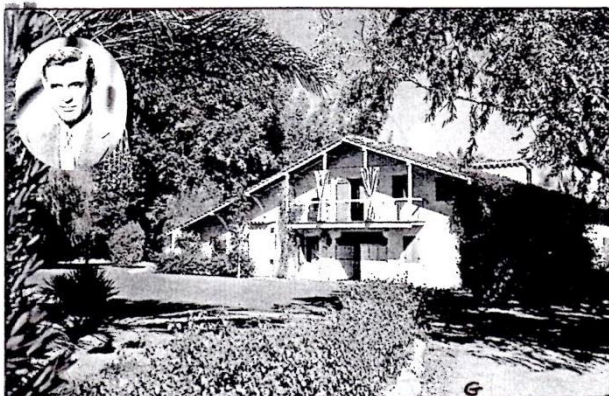
6.) He was Fox's top male star from 1935 to 1940. He served in the Marines in World War II. He gave up the "pretty boy" roles. He died of a heart attack on the set of Soloman and Sheba.



7.) Adventurer and athlete in real life, he began his career in an Australian documentary in 1933. He was one of Hollywood's highly paid stars in the mid 1930s through the early 1940s.

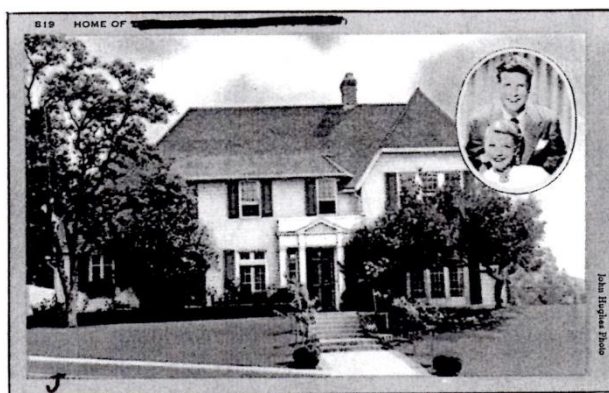
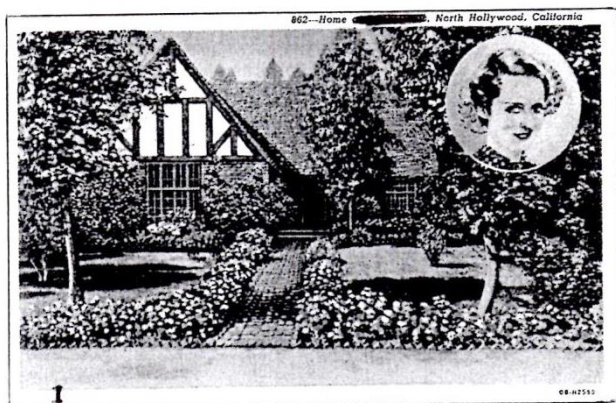


8.) He was discovered by Will Rogers while working as a telegraph operator. He wrote and sang 200 best-selling songs including "Here Comes Santa Claus".



9.) His 1930 weekly NBC musical quiz program was the Kollege of Musical Knowledge. He moved to TV in 1949 and vowed to retire when he earned \$1,000,000. He did in 1950!

10.) Impoverished in England, Archibald Alexander Leach had odd jobs in music halls. He soon learned to dance, do acrobatic stunts, stilt-walk and do pantomime. He had many hit films from 1931 through 1966.
