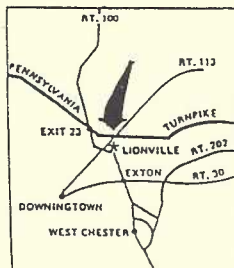

LANCOPEX '89 CACHET/CANCELLATION

The Cachet for LANCOPEX '89 recognizes Robert Fulton's contribution to the Steamboat. Born on a Southern Lancaster County farm in 1765, he went to England in 1786 to study art but became interested in engineering. He settled in Paris where his first steamboat navigated in 1803. Returning to the United States in 1805 he built the Clarmont in 1807. Fulton built the New Orleans in 1811 to navigate western waters. Near the end of the War of 1812 he built the first steam warship for the government. Robert Fulton is also credited with inventing the first torpedo and submarine.

The artwork on the cover is by McCaskey High School student Jim Saurbaugh. Jim also did the Horse and Buggy artwork for the cancellation.

The Steamboat Booklet stamps are used on the cover. The New Orleans is pictured on one of the stamps.

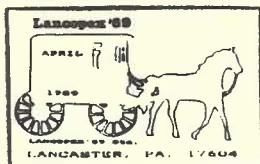
