GIVE STAMPS TO KIDS

LANCOPEX '92 CACHET/CANCELLATION

The Company of the Philadelphia and Lancaster Turnpike Road was chartered by the General Assembly in April 9, 1792. Completed in 1794 and officially opened in 1795, the turnpike was the first road of any consequence in America. Previously the King's Highway (now Route 340) ran from Philadelphia to Lancaster along Indian trails but by the late 1700's that road was inadequate for travel. The new road (now Route 30) began on the west side of the Schuylkill River near Philadelphia, ran over the Brandywine Creek near Downingtown and over Witmer's Bridge on the Conestoga Creek and into King Street in Lancaster.

The Lancaster Turnpike was a private enterprise with 10 shareholders, five from Lancaster. The building of the 62-mile turnpike was a grueling task. Many miles had to be cleared from wilderness and workers were always leery of unfriendly Indians. Total cost for the 20-foot wide road was \$465,000. The enterprise was a huge success for the investors and for travelers to and from Lancaster. Tavern owners profited also - with a tavern every mile along the 62-mile span. Nine toll booths collected tolls along the Turnpike, the last being at Witmer's Bridge in Lancaster.

The Company of the Philadelphia and Lancaster Turnpike Road was officially dissolved in 1902.

Much of the highway still exists as Routes 30 and 462 into Lancaster.
