PHILATELIC SOCIETY OF LANCASTER COUNTY

The Philatelic Society of Lancaster County was formally organized May 20, 1938 by 29 charter members motivated by Robert Ruppin, attorney-at-law, who had contacted the county American Philatelic Society members and other local persons interested in philately. A constitution with bylaws was adopted and without delay application for membership in the APS was filed. August 1, 1938 the society became the James Buchanan APS chapter #173.

The 1939 Membership Prospectus stated "From its inception the Society has made an effort to attract members of the highest type so that the membership will always be a body of mature men and women of high character, all interested in actively promoting the interests and welfare of Philately." That basic ideal holds true today as it did then.

In some respects the society functions today as it did then. Dues in 1938 were \$2.00 per year, \$3.00 per year in 1988, and still a bargain today at \$5.00 per year. Meetings are held monthly now as then (with a temporary reduction to every other month during World War II.) Now as then a variety of meeting content with expert speakers, member presentations, auctions, and purely social gatherings strives to appeal to the various interests of members.

Records of the organization are sketchy at best from World War II to the present. One can only speculate that the membership in the society waxed and waned with the general popularity of stamp collecting. Franklin Delano Roosevelt was a dedicated philatelist and brought the hobby of philately to the attention of many Americans during his presidency. Currently the Lancaster County Philatelic Society has 49 members.

In 1986 the society launched its first annual Stamp Show and Exhibition with James Boyles the driving force. These have been well attended giving exhibitors the opportunity to showcase their specialties and affording local philatelists contact with stamp dealers. After several years of meeting at Stauffer Mansion on the Lititz Pike in Lancaster the Society needed more space due to increased membership and in 1997 moved to the newly built Manor Township Community Building on Columbia Avenue.

In 1988 at the 50th anniversary of the LCPS two charter members, Robert Goodell and Albert Witmer, were still active members of the Society. None remain in the organization today but the current membership owes much to the founders of the Philatelic Society of Lancaster County. A successful organization builds upon the ideals and activities of previous members. We thank the original charter members for establishing the ideals and the hundreds of previous members for nurturing the Society for today's members.

REPRESENTATIVE JOSEPH PITTS

Lancopex '98 is honored to welcome U.S. Representative of the 16th District Joseph Pitts to the show on Saturday morning, May 2, 1998.

Representative Pitts has collected stamps most of his life and specializes in U.S. issues and stamps of the Philippines, where he once lived with his missionary parents. He is also interested in collecting printing errors and plate blocks. An interesting facet of his plate block collection is having some of them signed by famous people.

Recently, Pitts was instrumental in the design of an exhibit at the Smithsonian Institute's National Postal Museum. The exhibit, entitled "Mail to the Chief: The Stamp Designs of Franklin D. Roosevelt," draws attention to the little known fact that FDR (Also a stamp collector) designed nine stamps during his tenure in the White House.

In creating this exhibit, Joseph Pitts has become the only member of Congress to participate in such a capacity at the Smithsonian and has created a unique blending of politics and philately.
