EXPO EXHBIT BOARDS


Walter Mowrer is in charge of the Expo Exhibits. A 22"x28" board is recommended and there should be a title on your entry. Please keep the title an inch or two from the top of your board so the clip that holds the board won't obscure the title. You are encouraged to enter all four categories and you are allowed to enter two boards in each category. Please bring your boards to the Farm & Home Center the evening of August 16 or on Saturday morning prior to the opening of the show.

Judges will be selected from among the dealers before the show begins on Saturday, August 17. They will use the following criteria: Postcard Information 1/3, Presentation & Originally 1/3, Completeness & Rarity 1/3. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Awards receive \$15, \$10, \$5 in each category. Best of Show (\$25) is chosen from the 1st place exhibits. People's choice (\$25) is chosen by ballot. Every entry, including Honorable Mention receives a souvenir exhibit postcard for 2013.





Another dilemma, is the card that might be classified under several classifications. Look carefully at A Musical Turn which we show here. Elsewhere we've listed possible "homes" to tuck away this little gem.
